

Copyright infringement is the illegal reproduction or use of another's work. This could include photocopying, uploading or downloading data files, illegal peer-to-peer file sharing or any other unfair use of any work to which another entity has sole control over creation, reproduction and distribution.

Sanctions for persons convicted of copyright infringement can include both civil and criminal penalties, which could include any or all of the following:

1. Ordered to pay actual damages
2. Statutory damages of not less than \$200 nor more than \$150,000 per infringed work
3. Court costs and attorney fees
4. Incarceration
